

CCHS Ranked #1 in STEM...Again!





For the second year in a row, CCHS was ranked the #1 STEM high school in the state by U.S. News and World Report, and 16th in the nation. Over-all Concord received a score of 96.17/100, with a ranking of 30th in the State, putting CCHS ahead of 92% of other ranked high schools in MA.

New K-5 Reading Curriculum Rolled Out, \$367K in Grants Received

The roll-out of the **new** CPS K-5 reading curriculum has begun. <u>EL Education</u> is replacing the current program and will be phased-in over time. Dr. Hunter recently announced the application for and awarding of a \$376K grant to help defray costs. \$70K in Grants to Combat Antisemitism and Anti-Racism Received, Complaint Update

According to an <u>update</u> from Superintendent Hunter, \$70K in grants were applied for/awarded to, "support our anti-Semitism action plan as well as our goals in LGBTQ and anti-racism this year. Training, programming, and materials will allow us to further the work and promote discussions with students and staff about creating a welcoming and safe environment where everyone feels that they belong."

As many are aware, an <u>ADL complaint</u> was filed June 30th, "alleging that administrators' mishandling of antisemitic abuse allowed the targeting of Jewish students and forced at least one to transfer out of the district." Superintendent Hunter sent several progress updates (example from <u>August 1</u>) over the summer and there has been ongoing community/school cooperation to address this issue. Amenities Building at CCHS: August 19 Vote Failed

The project passed at Town Meeting on June 2, with 72% voting yes. However, despite broad support for this \$1.4M project, **voters rejected the question at the polls August 19**, effectively killing funding for the project as a borrowing article. Bridge coverage.

The unheated, rented, unlit plastic porta-potties at this 1700-seat community-use facility (CCHS Memorial Fields) continue to violate the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) (and plumbing codes). **What's Next:** Superintendent Hunter is planning to file an application to the CPC for funding, to avoid taxpayer impact. Hopefully the schools/town will find another way to fund/build this much-needed facility.



SC Supports/Praises Plan For New Training Facility To Honor Maisev O'Donnell

As reported in the <u>Bridge</u>, "The O'Donnells went before the School Committee last week, as The Beede Swim and Fitness Center is on the CCHS campus...School board members unanimously praised the O'Donnells' plan, which would add space and equipment for divers to practice maneuvers safely, with trampolines and harnesses, before transitioning to the pool."

The new playground is almost done! With a design focused on inclusivity, inspiration from nature and fun, the "Thoreau's Backyard" project was funded via community donations, which exceeded a \$610K fundraising goal. According to the Bridge, Principal "Sparks said officials planning Thoreau's campus upgrades were "trying to be creative with funding sources," understanding that the school budget could not absorb all the costs."
