## CPC Funds the CCHS Amenities Building, Public Works Green Lights Sewer Hookup

With a December 2, 2025 vote of 8:1 (1 abstention), the Community Preservation Committee (CPC) voted to fund the \$1.4M cost (Concord's share) of the CCHS Amenities Building, contingent upon the approval of a needed appeal regarding the sewer hookup by the Public Works Commission on Dec 11, which was approved by unanimous vote. It was disclosed that CCHS is only using 12% of its permitted sewer flow, so the addition of the flow from the amenities building should still be well-below the total threshold. The CPC has over \$4M available and was able to fund this and the other requests it received. Watch the discussion and vote [here](#). ## SC Meeting Recaps

Two school committee meetings have been held since our last newsletter.

The [November 5th](#) meeting welcomed representatives from both the CCHS Jewish Student Union and volunteers from Concord-Carlisle Against Antisemitism (CCAA). The CCHS Jewish Student Union is a newly formed organization that not only provides a forum for student discussions around Jewish culture and history but also seeks to provide educational opportunities within the school community. Both groups shared important updates about their efforts within the town and schools alike. Importantly CCAA recently secured a \$20,000 grant to implement its “Love Thy Neighbor” program. As part of that initiative, CCAA will be working with District leaders on programming for schools in Concord and Carlisle. The groups acknowledged the actions the district is taking to combat anti-semitism.

The [November 19th](#) meeting highlighted the [4th annual Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging \(DEIB\) Assembly](#) that took place at the High School on November 13th and served as a powerful reminder of the many voices and identities that make our school community vibrant. The assembly was unfortunately marred by the discovery of a white power symbol at the school that same day. While this incident was directly and immediately addressed by CCHS Co-Principals in a

message to the community (and they were lauded for this message), it was not raised at the SC meeting until brought up by SC Member Michael Williams and an emotional conversation ensued.

Our Take: In moments like this, transparency and accountability - grounded in compassion—are essential. The schools can and must respect confidentiality and student privacy laws while also providing clear, proactive communication when acts of hate occur. Naming the harm and acknowledging its impact (including the disciplinary response in general terms) does not compromise confidentiality; it strengthens trust.
