SC OKs Budget Amid Fiscal Pressures, Staff Layoffs Coming

The Concord School Committee has approved a proposed FY27 budget that reflects the significant financial pressures facing the district. While the budget maintains core programming, it also includes staff layoffs. District leaders emphasized that this proposal balances educational priorities with the fiscal realities imposed by rising costs and constrained revenues.

Regional School Committee Chair Tracey Marano said the budget “ensures that programs and services for CCHS students are maintained at levels that meet student need” and the cuts will create “budget savings that are passed on to taxpayers in Carlisle and Concord.”

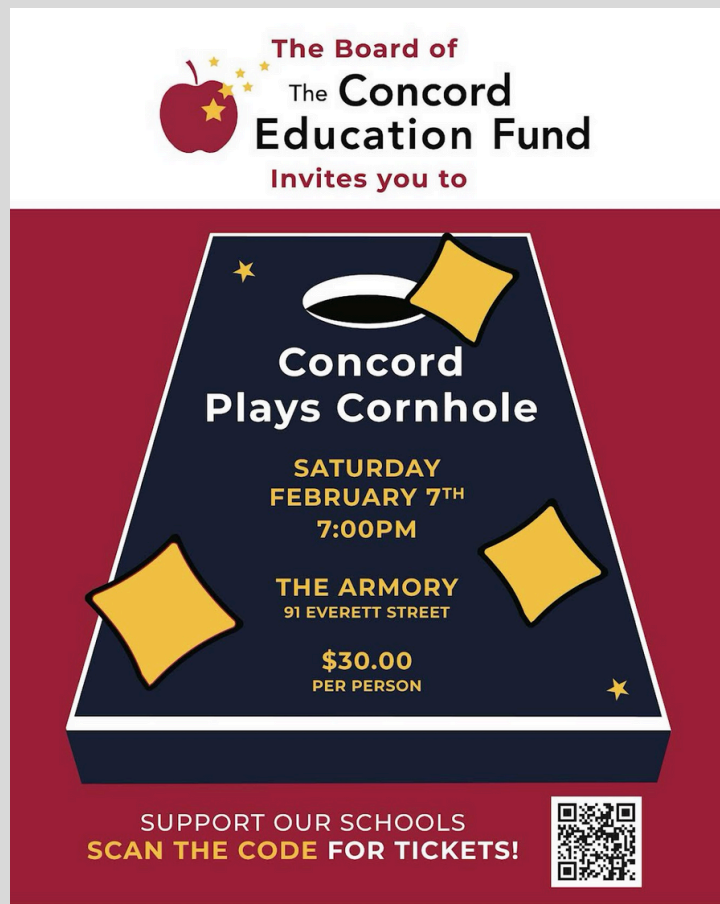
